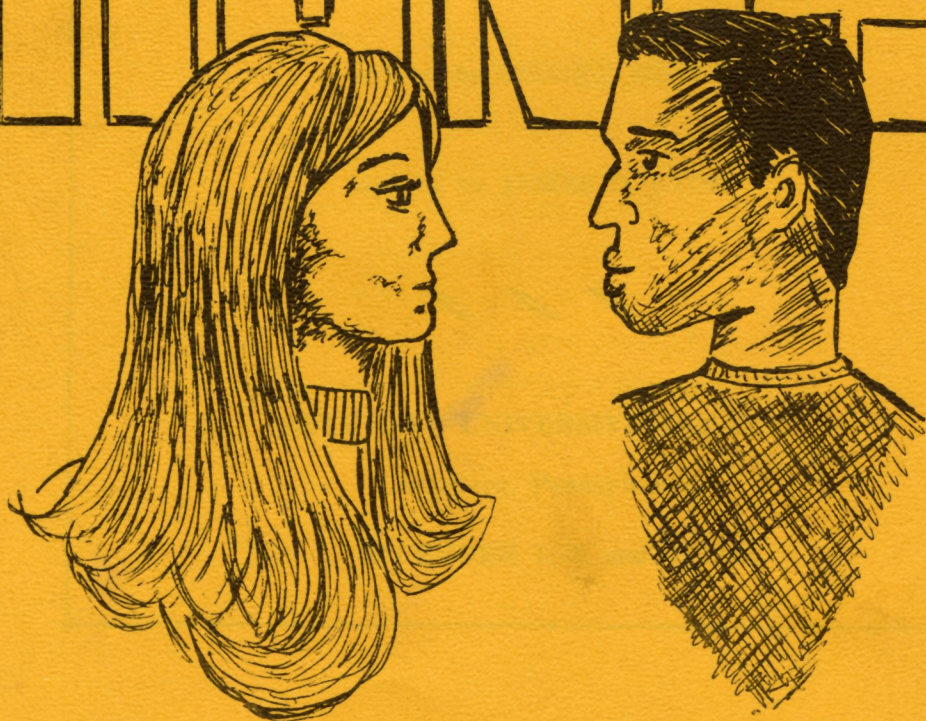

# About the play

*A Taste of Honey* is Shelagh Delaney's single major piece of work. It was written at age eighteen in response to what she felt was the need for improved theatre in England. The play was first presented in 1958 by Theatre Workshop at the Theatre Royal, Stratford, and again in London a year later, directed by Joan Littlewood.

The action takes place in Salford, England, the playwright's home, and reflects a young girl's changing attitude toward a social order and a way of life which she regards as both detestable and sordid. Living at a lower middle class level, economic necessity, as well as crass materialism, has fractured the family unit and estranged the individuals. The mother-daughter relationship between Jo and Helen becomes semi-personal on a first-name basis, and Jo's father figure is in the form of tenuous financial assistance from Helen's latest lover.

The solution for Jo and Helen involves interpersonal relationships with other characters in which they are forced to face social responsibilities and a definitive examination of their roles as individuals. Existentially, these relationships can provide a certain security for these females, which will be deceptive unless they have already developed an understanding of the relationship between love and need on its most fundamental level: mother and child. For here, love and life are most closely intermeshed. Responsibility is also essential. Awareness of surrounding conditions often produces the desire to escape, which can either take the form of actual physical absence or merely romantic fantasy and childlike oblivion. This is no more than a form of suicide, corrected only by acceptance of life situations made endurable through others.
