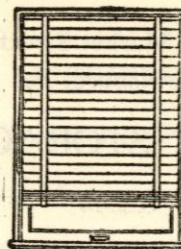

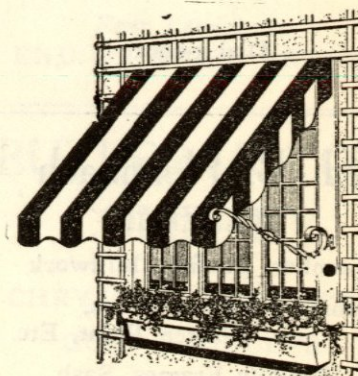

Peddling Patrimony

American heiresses encounter scarcely any difficulties in dissipating their assets among European paupers, erstwhile distinguished as nobles. Indeed, that is the only honorable profession still open to the receding Royalty. Old world titles and new world wealth are bartered with love in the background. And like the matrimonial mistakes of our movie frontiers these sex and swap suitors are soon found running neck and neck in their race to Reno. For a mere American to love one of these debutants with dough for her own virtues alone would be inconceivable. Of course he could only be after her money.

Johnny Case was the ideal exception. He first fell in love with Julia without knowledge of her wealth and at all times was without mercenary motives. But he whose greatest asset was a motivation obviously not that of a fortune hunter, became an outcast because he would not become a fortune hunter. Social security for the rich daughter would never be adequate until it became a problem to spend the ever increasing income.

We wonder if Johnny and Linda with her sensible sentiments, were so crazy after all. To know oneself, to analyze life and its meaning, is more important than the means of livelihood. The steering wheel is relatively light in weight and size, yet it is the most important part of an automobile. Wealth without character and brains without a good philosophy profiteth nothing. Both are vanity. A big shiny limousine with a liveried chauffeur is not the ultimate proof of a successful career. A lot of flowers and sincere mourners at your funeral tells a truer tale.

Wealth in itself is not a social crime. In the right hands it may be and often is a great asset to society. But in the manner of its acquisition and its use there may be plenty rotten in Denmark. For those who find more pleasure in giving than in getting and to those to whom all these things have been added, after they have placed first things first, there is no condemnation. For he that loves silver with increase, shall not be satisfied with silver, but whosoever sets his heart to understand and know wisdom loves his own soul. For wisdom is better than rubies and all things that may be desired are not to be compared to it. King David long ago prescribed the best social security, when he observed that he hadn't seen the righteous forsaken and his seed on relief. And another prophet urged that all the tithes be brought into the storehouse, that we might receive a blessing more than we could use. And He who had not where to lay His head, assured us that not a sparrow would fall to the ground without His notice, that even the very hairs of our head are numbered. Behold, He that keeps thee will not slumber or sleep, and if we acknowledge Him in all our ways, He will direct our path.

Certainly Johnny Case was right, He that loses his life shall save it and he that saves his life shall lose it. For what shall it profit a man if he gains the whole world and loses his own soul. Or what shall a man give in exchange for his soul.
