INTRODUCING THE PLAY

The production of "Ah, Wilderness!" brings back to the Bucknell campus a play written by the first dramatist of the American Theatre, Eugene O'Neill.

When "Ah, Wilderness!" was revealed at the Guild Theatre in New York starring George M. Cohan, the audience was astounded at a hitherto unsuspected interest of its author. Mr. O'Neill had previously grappled successfully with the more serious psychological problems of life but in "Ah, Wilderness!" he shows a tender understanding of everyday people in everyday life.

It is claimed that the play is partly autobiographical, and undoubtedly this is true; and the character of Richard is much akin to O'Neill himself when he was a dreamy, romantic boy in the home of his father and mother. Cap and Dagger, the Dramatics organization at Bucknell University, is proud to present this tender and happy comedy for their opening production of the 1950-51 season.
