In the course of his college career, Mr. Salsburg played leading roles in "Double Door", "Three Cornered Mcon", "Death Takes a Holiday", and "Craig's Wife". He understudied John Forsht, ex-'35, guest star of the 1937 Artist Course production, "Hamlet". In that play Mr. Salsburg clearly proved his ability by playing three roles and acting as assistant director, in addition to his understudy duties.

Mr. Salsburg has taken an active interest in the Wilkes-Barre Little Theatre, in whose productions of "Cradle Song", "Double Door", "Petrified Forest", "Hedda Gabler", "Ghosts", and "East Lynne", he filled major roles. He has been affiliated with a Louisville, Kentucky stock company, where he distinguished himself as the fine actor his associates have always known him to be.

Bucknell has met Mr. Salsburg on one occasion already this year. He was the announcer of our coastto-coast broadcast over the Mutual network in connection with the "Bucknell Way of Life" chapel program which took place last October in the Davis Gymnasium.

If a King David, in his lust and power, covets a Bathsheba for one of his numerous spares in the matrimonial mess of his age, the prophet condemns severely his action in murdering her husband. When King Ahab robbed and murdered a humble citizen to gain a desirable property, the odor of his administration has persisted to this day. Judas in time and eternity will never pay with penance for his ill-begotten thirty pieces of silver. American history has its Benedict Arnold, and Lincoln and McKinley will forever shine above their assassins.
