Life, Liberty, and the Pursuit of Rations. The Pedagog's Prestige in Democracy.



Our lend lease program, the distruction by submarines and the needs of our armed forces are rapidly causing serious shortages in our daily bread and modern conveniences. The lack of man power draws an ever decreasing circle of our national needs. To complicate everything financial wickedness in high places of cost-plus contracts and the high cost of thugs and criminals in the Union Labor leadership of our war efforts, are all heading us for a nice inflation. For the salaried man and the more normal wages of the non-war workers, inflation tends to an unfair advantage in a Democracy.

But the first born son of a Christian Democracy has reached maturity and is now dispensing Justice and equality for all in the matter of sharing our available supplies. The teacher and the maker of our democratic way of life, our public school system is contributing its splendid share in preserving this way of life. Our local school sytem, headed by Prof. H. E. Stover and by a very courteous and efficient group of High School teachers is performing a public service well worthy of any democracy. All of their services are contributed cheerfully and without compensation and they diminish in no manner what-so-ever the regular school work.

In addition to the work of our teachers, Mr. John Bucher and Mr. Clarence Watson of Mifflinburg are giving their time and talents to the important decisions of our local rationing board, which of necessity gives continuity to these rationing rules of our Democracy.

All of these public spirited citizens are contributing no small measure of success in the Democratic game of fair play for all and to the victorious conclusion of the war. Certainly all of you merit the commendation of your fellow citizens.
