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Building The Tombs Of The Saints

Woe unto you, chaplains and bishops—hypocrites!—for you are like whited sepulchres, which indeed appear beautiful outwardly, but are within full of dead saints' bones and of all uncleanness. Even so, you outwardly appear righteous unto men, but within you are full of hypocrisy and iniquity.

Woe unto you, heretic hunters and inquisitors—hypocrites!—because you build the tombs of the prophets and garnish the sepulchres of the righteous, and say that if we had been in the days of our fathers we wouldn't have been partakers with them in the blood of the prophets. Wherefore, be you witnesses unto yourselves, that you are the children of them that killed the prophets.

You serpents—you generation of vipers—how can you escape the damnation of hell?

Wherefore I send up to you prophets and scientists and women pioneers, and some of them you shall burn and kill, and some of them will you scourge by the Inquisition, and black-ball from city to city, that upon you may come all the righteous blood shed upon the earth, from St. Joan, forward and backward in history.

The alliance of corrupt politicians and fat and pompous and floridfaced clergy is not confined to ancient and medieval times; history has always found like priest and like politician and like people. Pure religion and undefiled is a way of life; a polluted priesthood is merely a means of living or a religious racket.

Rasputin, in recent Russian history, is a horrible example of the depths of degradation reached by some churches. The second world war started in Ethiopia, blessed and sanctified by the church. And what exhilarating sport it was to shoot wild and helpless natives from airplanes. It seems about time now for another shot in the arm of this religious bug juice. The first dose has lost its efficacy.

Christian America, in fighting for the high ideals of democracy, is not overlooking any bets in the way of war prosperity with the axis. Sordid war profits and patriotism march together.

Saint Joans will always be with us. They will always be misunderstood and unappreciated by their own generations. And the religious parties who condemn these helpless victims to the dirty work of the civil authorities will have the greater sin. A cloak of religion will save nobody from the just judgment of posterity.

But blessed art thou, Saint Joan, when priests and vested interests persecute you and say all manner of evil against you falsely, for great is your appreciation in the future. For the little minds and petty prejudices of today never prevail for long. For truth crushed to earth shall rise again.
