DIRECTOR'S NOTES

The scene is familiar. It happens each Thanksgiving or Christmas, whenever the college student comes home for a break. After dinner with everyone seated around the dining room table chatting amiably about who got married and who moved into the neighborhood, she boldly issues forth on a hotly contested issue — abortion, El Salvador, presidential politics, topics guaranteed to engage her parents, in spite of themselves, in an argument that leaves everyone infuriated. In the 60's, the generation gap was blamed for every social evil from family rifts to rock 'n roll. This dynamic does, indeed, have a kind of universal persistence or, at least a dramatic potential, if we think of Orestes or Hamlet or Gregar Werles coming home and creating havoc with the family whose values seem old fashioned, dangerous or even warped. In the 80's, the generation gap has taken on the status of a fundamental developmental stage, a necessary part of an adolescent's psychological individuation and identity. At the same time, the content of these family disputes, the positions taken and the ideologies declaimed, frame a political history, a chronicle of changing needs and values.

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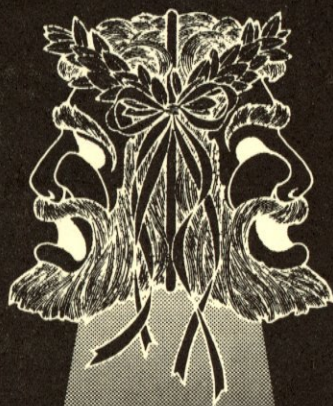

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This production is a Participating entry in the American College Theater Festival (ACTF). The aims of this national educational theater program are to identify and promote quality in college-level theater production. To this end, each production entered is eligible for adjudication by a regional American College Theater Festival representative. The production is also eligible for inclusion at the ACTF regional festival. Eight ACTF regional festivals are produced nationwide each year, and from these festivals up to six productions are selected to be part of the noncompetitive ACTF national festival at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts each spring. ACTF also sponsors regional and national level awards, scholarships, and special grants to student actors, playwrights, designers, and critics.

Last year more than 800 productions and 17,000 students participated in the American College Theater Festival nationwide. By entering this production in ACTF, our department is endorsing the ACTF goals to help college theater grow and to focus attention on the exemplary work produced in university and college theaters across the nation.
