

Director's Notes

Teachers play a powerful role in shaping a child's innocent, trusting mind. This role, often undervalued in our society, teaches children not only reading, writing, and arithmetic, but also how to think about themselves as part of society.

The Children's Story raises some interesting issues regarding the education of today's children. How can we teach children to think critically and still respect authority? Who should have the power to determine the subject matter in public schools? How can children recognize when someone manipulates their thoughts? How should religion be approached in school?

Who is to blame for the tragic events that we see in The Children's Story? According to James Clavell, we are. In today's world of latch-key kids and double income families, teachers play a more crucial role in the shaping of our children's value systems than ever before. Parents often fail to involve themselves in their child's learning process, leaving the decisions regarding the educational and moral growth of their child in the hands of someone else.

About the Author

James Clavell was born in Australia in 1924. In 1951 he moved to the US and became a citizen in 1956. He is perhaps most recognized for his novels about Eastern Asia, Shogun, Noble House, and Whirlwind. He has also written several screen-plays including The Great Escape, which is based on a true story.

The Children's Story, also a true story, was inspired by his daughter. His daughter came home from school one day asking for a dime if she recited the Pledge of Allegiance correctly. After receiving the dime, her father asked her what "pledge" and "allegiance" meant. She frowned. She did not know what these long words meant. The fact that her teacher would ask his daughter to memorize something without explaining the meaning startled Clavell. This act of omission by the techer drove into Clavell the great influence teachers have on their students.
