Choreographers Note: This piece is inspired by the rich stories and testimonies of immigation. In the 19th and 20th centuries, immigrants from Asia arrived to Angel Island in San Francisco with the common pursuit of a better life. Their experiences resulted in a tug of war between the American dream and longing for memories of home. As these people encountered hardships and adventures, poetry allowed them to express their journey. Having experienced a similar life path myself, I was eager to show these collective Asian immigrant experiences through an artistic lens.

The piece also showcases the special relationship of making a home out of the unfamiliar while maintaining the familiarity of one's original culture and navigating this balance. This also highlights the work put into preserving their distant connections even when their homes are oceans apart. While struggles of integrating into a new culture may seem insurmountable, this piece symbolizes the sense of hope that comes with experiencing love and loss in a new world.

# Guest Artist Biographies

**Li- Chou Cheng** started his professional training when he was 13 at the Beijing Dance Academy in China. At the age of 19, he joined the Beijing Central Ballet as a dancer and soloist and served as a Ballet Master and Rehearsal Director for the company. Since immigrating to the United States in 1980, Cheng has served as Assistant Professor at the University of Utah and Arizona State University. In 1988, Cheng was named the Principal teacher for both the Boston Ballet Company and School. Recently retired, Cheng was Professor of Professional Practice in Ballet with the School for Classical & Contemporary Dance at Texas Christian University for 28 years. As a guest teacher in demand nationwide, he has worked with many ballet companies and their summer dance programs, including, Boston Ballet, Atlanta Ballet, Ballet West, Ballet Met, Ballet Austin, Indianapolis Ballet, Eugene Ballet, Ballet Oregon, North Carolina School of the Arts, and Walnut Hill School of Arts. This year marked his 15th year to teach for Pittsburgh Ballet Theatre School Summer Intensive. His international teaching experience includes Beijing Dance Academy, The National Ballet School of Canada, The National Institution of Arts in Mexico, the Taipei National University of Arts, and the Cloud Gate Dance Theatre in Taiwan. In 2019 Mr. Cheng was invited to participate in the 60th anniversary of the Central Ballet of China and restage a classical pas de deux.

**Janice Rosario** is a nationally recognized contemporary dance choreographer, educator, and activist. As a native New Yorker, Janice studied at some of New York City's most elite institutions including Ballet Hispánico and The Alvin Ailey School. She is a graduate of Fiorello H. LaGuardia High School for the Performing Arts and Hunter College. She is currently on faculty at The Alvin Ailey School and founded the nonprofit, The Good Neighbor Collective Inc, to support and empower those underserved in our communities. As a choreographer, Janice has been commissioned by numerous prestigious institutions throughout the United States including: Ailey/Fordham University, Howard University, Dean College, Brockport University, Baltimore School of the Arts, Grand Canyon University, Irvine Valley College, Sacred Heart University, Drexel University, Hunter College, The Martha Graham School, New York Dance Project, Steps on Broadway's Conservatory, Fiorello H. LaGuardia High School for the Performing Arts, the Dance Institute of Washington, the Snug Harbor Cultural Center and Botanical Garden, Davidson High School, Passaic County Technical Institute, The Thacher School, the Joy of Motion Dance Center, Frank Sinatra High School for the Performing Arts, Fort Hamilton High School, Norte Maar's Counterpointe Series, Periapsis Music and Dance, La MaMa Moves! Dance Festival and the Battery Dance Festival.

Christen Moribondo graduated from Bucknell in 2016 with a degree in Arts Entrepreneurship and a minor in Dance. While on campus she was a member of the Bison Girls Dance Team and Kappa Alpha Theta Sorority, as well as a dancer, choreographer, and student director for the Fall and Spring Dance Showcases. She now works at QVC, in West Chester, PA, doing travel, expenses, and events. She has returned to campus to set a piece to the soundtrack of the Emmy award winning show, Succession, for the Fall Dance Concert.
