PLACE: London, England; Belfast and Bangor, Northern Ireland

Never in My Lifetime is set in the recent past (1970's); not all of the situations described in the play still arise. For example, organized fraternization between British troops and the populace to foster better relations—labeled "Hearts and Minds" by the army—has all but ended. But Northern Ireland is still a colony of Britain, and the impasse and animosity between Catholics and Protestants remain. A life for many consists of dire poverty and the continued threat of violence from all sides.

NOTES

The Playwright

Shirley Gee lives in London where she was born and brought up. She was an actress until her marriage to British actor Donald Gee. She has written several award-winning radio plays for the BBC and has also written and produced two television plays. Her play, *Typhoid Mary*, was produced by the Royal Shakespeare Company and the Bristol Old Vic in 1983. Originally written as a radio play, the stage version of *Never in My Lifetime* won the 1984 Smith Blackburn Prize for the best new play by an American or British woman. Her play *Ask for the Moon* was produced by the Hamstead Theatre Club in 1986 and published by Fabre and Fabre. Gee has recently completed a play, *Warrior*, for Theatre Royal, Stratford East, and is working on a radio play for the BBC's Globe Theatre for simultaneous transmission across the world in 1988.

A Few Significant Dates

- 1171 AD English King Henry II, encouraged by Popes Adrian IV and Alexander III, invaded Ireland and proclaimed himself Overlord of the entire island the independence of Gaelic Ireland came to an end.
- 1691 The Protestant Ascendancy, spurred by deposed King James II defeat at the battle of Boyne, was complete. Protestants (½0 of the population) gained control of the land and political office excluding Catholics and other religions from basic civil rights;
- 1801 The United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland came into being; the union was not popular in Ireland the breach between Catholics and Protestants widened;
- 1906 SINN FEIN, a new political party that pursued the Republican dream of home rule, was founded.;
- 1912 a new home rule measure was near passage but the Ulster Unionists resisted the measure and prepared for Civil War;
- 1913 The ULSTER VOLUNTEER FORCE, a quasi-legal army of protestants, was formed; fighting broke out;
- 1913 Irish founded IRISH VOLUNTEER FORCE, for the defense of Irish freedom;
- 1920 the Government of Ireland Act was adopted, creating a northern and southern Ireland;
 - 1921 Southern Ireland became the Irish Free State;
- 1922 Northern Ireland opted to maintain its strong ties with the central government of the U.K.

Pre-1969 IRA Leadership — laid emphasis on political aspects of their struggle for civil rights in Northern Ireland;

1970's — the Provisional IRA — came to dominate the para-military scene on the Catholic side, as well as the political side; the policy of the provisional IRA is to unite Ireland by a combination of military violence and efforts to mobilize public opinion;

Opposing Voices

"...we pledge to Ireland our love, and we pledge to English rule in Ireland our hate... life springs from death: and from the graves of patriot men and women spring living nations... The Defenders of this Realm... think that they have pacified Ireland... the fools, the fools! They have left us our Fenian dead, and while Ireland holds these graves, Ireland unfree shall never be at peace." Padraic Pearse, Irish poet, schoolmaster and political leader, 1915.

Papal Audience

If it requires a special kind of nerve to heckle a pope, the Rev. Ian Paisley has it. Mr. Paisley, a leader of the hard-line Protestants in Northern Ireland, last week disrupted a speech to the European Parliament by Pope John Paul II, who Mr. Paisley implied was somehow sympathetic to the Irish Republican Army. Almost as soon as the Pope began his speech in Strasbourg, France, Mr. Paisley, a member of the European Parliament, rose from his seat holding a poster saying, "Pope John Paul II — Antichrist," and shouted, "I renounce you as the Antichrist." Other members of Parliament snatched the sign away and threw papers at Mr. Paisley, who was then quickly ejected from the building. An unruffled John Paul continued his speech. New York Times, October 16, 1988"

Bognor — small seaside resort on the Kent coast of England.

pig - an armored vehicle.

pongs - smells.

doddle - easy, no trouble; piece of cake.

Dragon's Teeth — refers to the Greek myth in which the planting of serpent's teeth in the ground produced the birth of warriers, who then sprange from the earth.

Armelite — rifle preferred by the IRA because it can be broken down into small pieces and smuggled easily.

squaddie - derogatory term for a British enlisted man.

thunderflash — firecracker/smoke bomb; Harmless, loud, dirty, alarming.

Hearts and Minds — efforts in the recent past by the British army to form a sympathetic bond with the citizens of Belfast, to win them over with organized fraternization. A cup of tea, a sporting or social event, a children's outing. Looked at cynically by both sides.

great crack - great news.

APC — armored personnel carrier; a kind of paddy wagon for troops.

lost his bottle - lost his nerve.

Provo-minded — refers to the Provisional arm of the IRA, the faction devoted to the eviction of the British, by violence if necessary.

knees-up — a party.
