


When we look below the surface we see the effects of throwing a stone. It is altogether fascinating and beautiful and symbolic. Beneath the surface, a void filled with air forms behind the plunging sphere whose interface with the water builds in tension as the sphere dives deeper. To minimize energy the interface minimizes its surface area forming an hourglass shape in the

same way that a hanging rope forms a catenary. Capillary waves generated at the front of the sphere propagate along the interface growing into polygonal waves that populate the entire wall. The interface is perturbed. At greater depth hydrostatic pressure from the surrounding fluid drives the interface inwards to eventual collapse. Snap! A Worthington jet shoots up and pockets of air shake and collide and float to the surface or plunge with the sphere. As time lingers bubbles of air and oil float to the surface. Resetting. Possibly for another stone. What really happens when we throw stones? It can be hard to fathom what occurs beneath. To every action there is a reaction altogether profound. — LINDA SMOLKA

Guest Artist Biographies

Mike Ford (choreographer)

Mike Ford has choreographed for dance companies, including Chicago-based Matter Dance Company, and theater productions, including shows for the Raven Theater, Kokandy Productions, Mortar Theater Company, Street Tempo Theater, and Concordia College. He has performed professionally as an equity dancer at Walt Disney World as well as in Miami and Las Vegas and for numerous TV specials. Mike was a staging specialist for Walt Disney World parades and shows. In Chicago, he has been seen in musical theater productions and as a dancer with Matter Dance, Monocle Eclectic, Core Project, Tap Man Productions, and RASA Dance. Mike spends his daytime hours as an architect, focusing on the preservation of historic buildings.

Beth Iguchi (choreographer)

Beth Iguchi, dance educator/choreographer/performer, has served on the faculties of the University of the Arts - Philadelphia, University of California - Irvine, Los Angeles County High School for the Performing Arts, The Colburn Dance Institute - LA, CityDance Conservatory - Washington, DC, and many more. She is a former member of the Danny Sloan Dance Company of Boston and founder/artistic director of Paradigm Dance/Boston/Philadelphia/Los Angeles. As a choreographer and educator, Ms. Iguchi continues to do master classes, residencies, and commissions with conservatories, universities, and professional companies. Last spring she created curriculum for a dance composition class, The Art of Choreography, at Georgetown University. This past summer she taught the modern component for the Dance Theatre of Harlem Summer Intensive and has most recently finished a residency in Washington, DC. She is pleased to be back working with the talented dancers of Bucknell University setting excerpts from her work, "Between the Keys," most recently set on Washington Reflections Dance Company in DC. Ms. Iguchi is a Luigi master, but her technique has evolved into a fusion of contemporary jazz and modern. Luigi, Horton, and ballet are at the core of the technique, but, creativity, dialogue, spatial relationship, breath in movement, and "heart" are the essence of her work.

Andrew Roddewig (videographer)

Andrew Roddewig is the co-founder and creative director of Clarion New Media, a video production company specializing in web content. Andrew and Clarion have produced hundreds of videos across all spectrums, from advertising and marketing, to intimate artist installations and performances. Andrew believes that video has an ability to communicate the human condition in a unique way. He is the executive producer of the recently released "The Adventures of Jacketman," a series for young adults about the struggle to find one's identity in a world where being a super hero is so common it's mundane.

Atiya Stokes-Brown (choreographer)

A native of Philadelphia, Atiya Kai Stokes-Brown began her training at the Sydney King School of Dance. She later studied at the New Freedom Theatre (under the direction of Patricia Scott Hobbs), where she worked with several artists including Kariumu Welsh, Deborah Chase-Hicks, and Jawole Willa Jo Zollar; and at the Philadelphia Dance Company (Philadanco), where she was a member of Danco II, the company's apprentice performance group. Atiya graduated with a BA in Dance and Politics from Randolph-Macon Woman's College where she studied with Pamela Risenhoover and performed works made famous by the Martha Graham Dance Company, Jose Limon Dance Company, the Joffrey Ballet, the Paul Taylor Dance Company, and the Jump Rhythm Jazz Project. She also studied at the University of the Arts, the American Dance Festival, the Merce Cunningham Dance Company, and the Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater. After a 15-year dance hiatus to pursue her Ph.D. in Political Science and become a tenured professor, Tia is delighted to study, perform, teach, and create dance here at Bucknell.
