Director/Choreographer Hotes

We started by asking the question, "What was Melchior reading?" We learned that he reads Nietzche and Goethe, writes an original essay, "The Art of Sleeping With" including life-like illustrations, and he consistently writes in his personal journal and composes love letters to his girlfriend. We saw the connection here with one of the musicals major themes, the power of education to promote knowledge, curiosity, critical thinking and literacy and we also discovered that the play reveals the power of educational methods to set the trajectory of an individual's life. Nietzsche, for example, wrote about the educational reforms of late 19th C. Germany and how shame had replaced corporeal punishment "to manipulate students into lives of rectitude." Shame leads to devastating effects in *Spring Awakening*.

Many college students adore this musical. It speaks to them as *Rent* or *Hair* spoke to earlier generations. The controversial subject matter of *Spring Awakening* explores the confusion and sometimes desperation of adolescent sexuality when Victorian parents were too prudish to discuss what these new urges signify. One might think that in our contemporary sexually explicit era, young people have all of the sex education that they need; but this musical rings true to today's student audience because they regularly experience misinformation about "good sex," confusing sexual norms, confined gender roles and the repeated failure of parents and teachers to adequately address these issues. The plague of sexual abuse is just one example of this failure.

Our creative process began with physical workshops, which helped the actors to identify character, build ensemble, and develop a common physical/emotional vocabulary capable of creating motifs and narrative arcs. The movement and choreography evolved from these workshops. Actor-driven gestures and movement created the basis of a choreography that connects emotion and intention in the body and the voice communicating not only the narrative of the lyrics, but offering subtext as well — a way of deepening character and context. The powerful collaboration among the elements of acting, voice, movement and design works to create a cohesive experience for the performers as well as the audience.

Actors have created the world of the play through objects and set pieces imbued with meaning and transformed to fit the needs of the story. Stairs become trees, benches a bridge, flowers and notebooks symbols and metaphors. Especially in the songs, the teens of this world do what they can to create their own inner reality, one that reaches beyond their repressive, protective, abusive, societal prison. This powerful rock music as well as the fluid transitions between scenes remind the actors and the audience that they possess agency in their world. They have the power to reimagine, to reinvent, or to destroy.

A special note from the director, Professor Gary Grant: Spring Awakening is my last production and I want to dedicate this work to the people who have made my long run at Bucknell University possible. From Urinetown and The Singular Life of Albert Nobbs to Fefu and Her Friends, my faculty colleagues have taught me about the theatre as a collaborative art. To the scores of talented students who have performed in productions ranging from The Tempest and Twelfth Night to our Evenings of Beckett and 60's one acts in Café Tustin, I deeply appreciate your dedication to the discovery of the expressive self in your theatre work. Especially to our audience who have encouraged my fascination with Sam Shepard in The Tooth of Crime, True West, Action and Shepardfest, thank you for your support. I am proud to be a part of Bucknell's 125 year-long theatrical tradition. Let's raise a glass together to the future!
