Guest Artist Biographies

Li-Chou Cheng was born in Shanghai, China. He started his professional training at the Beijing Dance Academy and at the age of 19 he joined the Beijing Central Ballet and served as a dancer, ballet master and rehearsal director. After immigrating to the United States in 1980 he taught at the University of Utah and Arizona State University as assistant professor. In 1988, he joined Boston Ballet as a principal teacher. Currently Mr. Cheng is on faculty as a Professor of Professional Practice in Ballet and Modern Dance with the School for Classical and Contemporary Dance at Texas Christian University since 1990. In demand nationwide as a master teacher, he has worked with many ballet companies including Boston Ballet, Pittsburgh Ballet, Atlanta Ballet, Ballet West, Ballet Met, Ballet Austin, Hartford Ballet, Indianapolis Ballet, Eugene Ballet, Ballet Oregon. He has also taught in many universities and conservatory programs as well as internationally at the National Ballet School of Canada, Mexico Institute of the Arts, Taipei National University of Arts, China Culture University, and The Cloud Gate Dance Theatre in Taiwan. Mr. Cheng received the Larry White dance educator award in September 2007.

Praised by the *New York Times* as a "fiery musician" whose playing is "vigorous and passionate," Chinese-born pianist **Qing Jiang** enjoys a diverse career in solo, chamber, and contemporary music. Since her American debut at age 17, she has performed to acclaim across the United States and abroad, including concerts in Alice Tully Hall, Carnegie Hall, Jordan Hall, UK's Snape Maltings Hall, and China's Shenzhen Poly Theater; solo engagements with the Chattanooga Symphony, the Britten-Pears Orchestra, the Aspen Music Festival Orchestra, and the Adrian Symphony; and festival appearances at Ravinia, Yellow Barn, Music@Menlo, Aldeburgh, Kneisel Hall, the Perlman Music Program, and Aspen. A dynamic chamber musician, Dr. Jiang has collaborated with Itzhak Perlman and Donald Weilerstein, as well as with members of the Emerson, Juilliard, Shanghai, Kronos, and Parker string quartets. A former Jack-Kent-Cooke Arts Scholar, she holds degrees from Arizona State University, Juilliard, and New England Conservatory. Dr. Jiang is currently Assistant Professor of Piano at Bucknell University, and piano faculty at the Kneisel Hall Chamber Music School and Festival. Prior to Bucknell, she has served on the faculty at Yellow Barn, the Curtis Institute of Music, and New England Conservatory Preparatory School. qingjiangpiano.com

Ivan Mayolo was born and raised in Mexico City, where he started his training in Contemporary Dance with the Morphoria Dance Group at the age of 15. In 2010 he attended the Lester B. Pearson United World College of the Pacific in Victoria, Canada, to complete the International Baccalaureate program. Ivan then attended Bucknell University and graduated in May 2016 with a dual degree in Markets, Innovation & Design, and Dance: Performance and Production. In his undergraduate years, he attended several dance festivals, including ACDA-Northeast, American Dance Festival at Duke University, and ADF Winter in New York City. He has performed with the Bucknell Dance Company since the Fall of 2012, and has choreographed new works a total of four times for the Bucknell Dance Showcase, and three times for the Bucknell Dance Company. Currently Ivan is pursuing a master's of Science in Education, in College Student Personnel at Bucknell University.

Praised for his elegant, expressive conducting, **Christopher Para** has produced exceptional performances from outstanding orchestras in England, The Czech Republic, Poland, Bulgaria, and The United States. His guest conducting appearances include return engagements with the Corinthian Chamber Orchestra of London, as well as appearances with The Hradec Králové Philharmonic Orchestra and the Bohuslav Martinu Philharmonic Orchestra of the Czech Republic, and the Borgas Philharmonic Orchestra of Bulgaria. He appears in a number of radio and televised concerts, most recently with the acclaimed, all-woman Celtic

music and dance ensemble *Cherish the Ladies*, and vocalist Maura O'Connell, conducting an on-camera orchestra for the Emmy Award winning PBS special *Cherish the Ladies – An Irish Homecoming*. The program was broadcast on PBS stations nationwide, and in the British Isles by Ireland's TG4.

A native of California, Christopher Para began his musical studies with the viola. After receiving his undergraduate and graduate degrees in viola performance from the Eastman School of Music, he undertook post-graduate conducting studies at London's Guild Hall School of Music and Drama with Alan Hazeldine, and studied with Pierre Boulez at the Boulez International Conducting Master Class. He was selected to attend the Aspen and Pierre Monteux conducting programs.

Christopher Para's awards and distinctions include the 1995 Marienbad Conductor's Prize. He was honored in 2001 by being named The Pennsylvania/Delaware String Teachers' Association's Orchestra Conductor of the Year. A member of the music faculty of Bucknell University, Professor Para conducts the Bucknell University Orchestra, and teaches violin, viola, and conducting.

Senior Biographies

Alyssa Caputo will graduate in May with a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology and a minor in Italian Studies and Dance. When she was two years old, Alyssa began dancing and pursued dance seriously throughout middle school and high school in New Jersey at New Jersey Dance Theatre Ensemble and Ballet Forte. At Bucknell, Alyssa is an Arts Merit scholar and has been a part of the Bucknell Dance Company since her freshman year. She has worked with guest artists such as Kelly & Mollye Maxner, Chelsea Dieck, Beth Iguchi, Li-Chou Chen, and Michael Bearden. Alyssa held a leadership position in the company as Public Relations Chair. Upon graduation, Alyssa will be pursuing a Masters of Science in Accounting and MBA at Northeastern University in Boston.

Genna Hartnett will graduate in May with a Bachelor of Arts in International Relations and a double minor in French and Dance. Genna began her dance training at the Rock Schools for Dance Education in West Chester and Philadelphia, Pennsylvania under the tutelage of Mariaelena Ruiz and Jennifer Wheat Kurmlavage. Since coming to Bucknell as an Arts Merit Scholar, Genna's passion for dance and the arts have only flourished through the liberal arts curriculum. In her time at Bucknell, she has danced in original works by Matthew Neenan, Li-Chou Cheng, Jeffrey Peterson, Er-Dong Hu, Kelly Knox, Dustyn Martincich, and Ivan Mayolo. In addition, Genna's original choreography has been highlighted in the Dance Showcases and the Bucknell Dance Company's Fall 2016 Concert. More recently she served as the Movement Director for the Theater Mainstage Production of *Next to Normal*. Upon graduation, Genna will be accepting a Marketing Internship with Ballet X in Philadelphia, PA.

Brittany Hurley: Brittany will graduate in May with a Bachelor of Arts in Economics and Political Science, and a minor in Dance. Brittany has danced since she was three years old, with the majority of her training under the direction of Natasha Bar at the American Youth Ballet in Salisbury Mills, New York. At Bucknell, Brittany is an Arts Merit Scholar in Dance and has performed for both Showcase and Mainstage performances, joining the Bucknell Dance Company as a sophomore. She has worked with guest artists such as Li-Chou Cheng, Michael Bearden, and Julia Ehrstrand, and has held leadership positions in the company as both Public Relations Coordinator and currently Student Director. Brittany's plans for post-graduation are still to be determined.

Abigail Garrett will graduate in May with a Bachelor of Arts in Biology and Spanish and a minor in Dance. Abigail began dancing at the age of three and competed throughout middle school and high school with the G. Scotten Talent Center, Performer's Edge, and the Brebeuf Jesuit Preparatory School Dance Team. In her time at Bucknell, Abigail has performed in many Bucknell Dance Showcases and has choreographed several

pieces for the Showcases and the Bucknell Dance Company. She has worked with guest artists such as C. Kemal Nance and Jeffrey Peterson.
